Adult Day Program -

Join our Adult Day Program and gain meaningful hands-on experience supporting older adults in a community-based care setting. Students will assist with daily program facilitation, recreational and cognitive activities, transportation support, meal service, client engagement, and social programming designed to promote independence and well-being. This position offers valuable experience working directly with seniors, including individuals living with dementia and/or age-related health challenges, while building transferable skills for future careers in healthcare, social work, therapeutic recreation, and community services. The program operates in Erin, Monday through Thursday.

Community Support Services -

Our Community Support Services program offers students a unique opportunity to work directly with individuals and families accessing essential community resources. Students may assist with outreach services, food bank distribution in Erin and Rockwood, holiday hamper programs, information and referral support, income tax clinic intake, and helping clients navigate government forms and social assistance applications. Through this role, students will gain practical experience in community engagement, client support, advocacy, service coordination, and understanding the barriers many individuals face when accessing support systems. This is an ideal opportunity for students interested in social services, healthcare, public policy, community development, or non-profit work.

New to You and Bookend Thrift Stores -

Students joining our New To You and Bookends thrift store team will gain valuable experience in both retail operations and non-profit community services while contributing directly to programs that support individuals and families in the community. Responsibilities may include processing donations, sorting books and clothing, organizing merchandise, assisting customers, maintaining store presentation, and supporting the overall operations of a second hand store. This role helps students build transferable skills in customer service, communication, organization, inventory management, teamwork, and provides insight into how community donations and social enterprise initiatives help sustain essential charitable programs.

Fundraising/Marketing/Event Planning -

Our fundraising, marketing, and event planning opportunities provide students with practical experience supporting the growth and visibility of a community-based non-profit organization. Students may assist with coordinating fundraising initiatives, planning community events, creating promotional materials, designing flyers and advertisements, and helping execute outreach campaigns that engage the broader community. This role helps students build transferable skills in event coordination, communications, marketing, project

management, creative design, and understanding how strategic fundraising supports essential community services.
